




#### Winners of the SAA Ethics Bowl:

Heather Thakar, Dana Bardolph, Sarah Mellinger, and Jenna Santy (with Lynn Gamble as the faculty mentor) won SAA 76th Annual Meeting Ethics Bowl this year! The ethics bowl is a debate-style competition designed to explore the ethics of archaeological practice. Issues ranged from NAGPRA and Indigenous interaction to sexual/gender discrimination in academia. They were awarded \$500 to return next year to defend their title.

Heather Thakar was awarded the Dean's Advancement Fellowship from Graddiv and an NSF Dissertation Improvement Grant. She was also appointed to the SAA Committee on Museums, Collections and Curation.

Visiting scholar **Adrian Jaeggi** (currently conducting post-doctorate research with Michael Gurven) was awarded a prestigious 2-year junior fellowship from UCSB's Sage Center for the Study of the Mind.

The UC Irvine Department of Anthropology invites you to the 2011 **Anthropology in Transit Workshop: Traces and Remainders**, Friday, April 8th, 10:00 am – 5:00 pm, Social and Behavioral Sciences Gateway (SBSG), Room 1517.

This year's Anthropology in Transit workshop will build on the successes of the two day-long, commuter-friendly symposia we held during the 2009-2010 academic year. We are pleased to continue this forum,

informally termed the "405/91/5 workshops," as a means of promoting dialogue between colleagues in the region. This workshop is a space for graduate students to present papers, discuss their work, and expand possibilities for anthropological research. We hope the workshop will contribute to a regional community of young scholars, as well as strengthened networking with faculty in Southern California. The first two Anthropology in Transit workshops focused on various modes of movement and shifts; this Spring's workshop builds on these conversations by providing graduate students the opportunity to explore that which "remains." We thus ask what new insights arise when we attend to what is, in one or another sense, left behind.

#### Postdoctoral Position in Natural and Cultural Heritage, Stanford University

The Stanford Archaeology Center announces a postdoctoral position in global heritage that specifically connects natural and cultural patrimony and conservation. The appointment carries a twelve-month salary commensurate with the University Provost established minimum pay levels based on research experience. The appointment may be eligible for renewal for up to two years based on satisfactory performance and the existence of funding. Postdoctoral scholars are required to be in residence in the Stanford area during the term of the appointment. Applicants must have received their Ph.D. no earlier than September 1, 2008, and have completed all degree requirements by July 1, 2011. U.S. citizenship is not required.

Application deadline: April 15, 2011. The position will begin in September, 2011. Please direct inquiries to archaeology@stanford.edu.

**Society of Fellows, Harvard University, Junior Fellowships**, beginning July 1, 2012. These prize fellowships are useful for able scholars who plan to work in fields traditionally kept apart in graduate instruction. If still pursuing the PhD, Junior Fellows should be at the dissertation stage of their theses and be prepared to finish their degrees within a year of becoming fellows.
